Please join us in welcoming the Rev. Dr. Anthonette Wright as our worship leader today. Rev. Dr. Wright has been the Pastor of The Community of Hope Baptist Church since 2011. A North Carolina native, she received her Master of Divinity degree from Shaw University Divinity School, and her Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. We're delighted to have her with us.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is "delivering immediate aid to those impacted by Hurricane Florence. Initial assessments suggest catastrophic destruction, but the full scope of the damage will not be known for many months. PDA is deploying teams to affected presbyteries to meet with Presbyterian and community leadership to assist in coordinating relief efforts and mucking out homes and churches. After initial needs are addressed, PDA will remain - providing spiritual emotional care and long term recovery to address unmet needs of those impacted."
Gifts for recovery via the work of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance may made be made out to Milner Memorial, with 'Hurricane Florence' noted in the memo. The church office will forward your donations promptly to PDA.

Next Sunday, October 7th is World Communion Sunday. Remember we'll join Rev. Tim Poston and the Joy of Discovery congregation for worship in the Sanctuary that day. We'll also receive PC(USA)'s Peace and Global Witness offering. Today's insert offers an example of the difference your giving makes when these funds are put to work. 25% of what you give to this offering will stay in our region for ministries of peacemaking, with 25% remaining with Milner for the same use. The remaining 50% will be put to use promoting peace and reconciliation throughout the world.
